TO BE ANSWERED BY APPLICANTS FOR AID TOWARDS THE
FITTING-UP OF SCHOOLS,

THE PAYING TEACHERS, AND THE OBTAINING SCHOOL REQUISITES.

- 1.—What is the name of the School, and when was it established? } *Four mile Water Parochial School, established in the year 1814*
- 2.—In what Townland, Parish, and County, is it situated? } *Carrighna, Durrus, Co. K.*
- 3.—What is the Name and distance of the nearest Post-Town, and in what direction from it? } *Country, about five miles, East*
- 4.—State, particularly, whether the School is, or has been, in connexion with, or has derived aid from any other Society—and if so, the name of the Society, the amount of the Aid received, and the nature of the connexion? } *It is not in connexion with any society and of course received no aid*
- 5.—What days of the week are intended, in conformity with these Regulations, to be devoted to combined Moral and Literary Education, and how many hours on each day—and what day or days are to be set apart, each week, for Religious Instruction only? Or what hour before or after School hours on every School day? } *Monday, Sunday, Thursday and Friday are to be devoted to moral and literary education and Wednesday and Saturday for religious instruction*
- 6.—Have the Clergymen of the different denominations in the Parish, or in the neighbourhood of the School, been applied to in order to obtain their signatures to this application? } *The Rev. Mr. St. John of this Parish was applied to for his signature, but refused as the nature of the scriptures were not read in his school.
